Whooping Cough Mobile Clinics in Pierce County

Pierce County has a regular calendar of mobile clinics where people can get the TDAP shots nearly every day. The clinics are geared towards children, but they have adult vaccinations available as well. For adults that do not have insurance or are underinsured, you can get a TDAP shot at these clinics.
