



Dear Foster Parents:

We have exciting news to report. Due to the tireless efforts of Foster Parents Association of Washington State (FPAWS), foster parents will receive an increase in their monthly reimbursement. (I have not seen this officially posted, but hope to in the next few days)

- 0–5 (year olds) will increase \$138.00 to \$562.00 (month)
- 6–11 (year olds) will increase \$182.00 to \$683.00 (month)
- 12+ (year olds) will increase \$127.70 to \$703.00 (month)

**Foster Parents Camp Free**

WA resident foster parents and registered relative caregivers who camp with the children in their care are entitled to free campsites in WA state parks. Participants in the program may camp at first-come, first-served parks or make a telephone reservation to camp in a reservation park (call 1-888-226-7688). Eligible participants making reservations do not pay for camping but are charged the reservation fee to hold sites in the reservation system.

To get free camping when making a reservation, tell the operator you are a foster parent. When you arrive at the park to register, show a WA ST Driver's license along with a Foster Care ID card or your Foster Care license. Foster parents and registered relative caregivers also may use State Parks boat launches and pump outs for free when they camp.
